Select the song you want to use to create the ringtone and click on it.3. right-click the song and select the Song info option.4. Click the Options tab.5. Select the maximum 30-second duration in the song that you'll want to create a ringtone for. Apple limits your ringtones to 30 seconds, so you won't be able to have anything longer Choose your time, make sure you set the time in minutes and seconds. So if you want to start the ringtone at 1 minute and 34 seconds, enter 1:34 in the start field. Then put it to an end 30 seconds later at 2:04. After you choose your time, make sure to play back to make sure it's the sn piece of song you really want.6. Click OK.7. With the song marked, click File > Convert and select the internal option from Create AAC Version. Apple's iTunes instantly converts the 30-second audio clip you just selected to create.8. Right-click the ringtone you just created and on your Mac, select the Show in Finder option. On a Windows PC, search for a song in your Windows Explorer pane to find the location of the song on your hard drive.9. Change the file extension of a song .m4a .m4r. That's because Apple uses the .m4r extension for ringtones instead of familiar ringtones .m4a. When prompted to keep .m4a or go with .m4r, select after.10. Keep the window open and plug iPhone into your computer. You'll see iPhone pop up on the left side of the screen.11. Drag and drop the .m4r ringtone you just created into the option in the left bar, under your iPhone, which means Tone. Then it will be seen under the ringtone section in your iPhone.12. Go through your iPhone and click Settings.13. Under Settings, choose Audio & Haptics.14. Scroll down to Ringtone and tap that option.15. Here, you will see your ringtone. Pick it. Ringtones should also play, so you can make sure it works properly and everything is good to go. If you want to personalize your phone in a way that not many others take the time to do, you need to know how to create a ringtone for the song. Unlike buying ringtones in the iTunes Store, this is free. And unlike the various free ringtones you can download, they are personalized and use the songs you've loved. The process isn't as simple or simple as most iPhone tasks, as Apple doesn't include any kind of integrated method to set your existing songs as ringtones. You'll need to use iTunes on your computer, and follow a few steps to convert your desired song to a special file format, then sync it to your iPhone. However, as you learn how to do this, you can do it easily for multiple songs and set up custom ringtones for all your favorite contacts. The instructions in this article apply to all models of iPhone and iTunes 12, 11, 10, and 9. This process starts on your computer, where you'll use iTunes to select a 30-second portion of a song and export the song clip in format that your iPhone can identify as a ringtone. Start iTunes on your computer. Always a good idea to make sure you're running the latest, most, version of iTunes, if you do not use it often, to make sure that it will synchronize properly with your phone. If iTunes offers to install the latest update, let that happen before continuing. From the iTunes music library, find a song that you want to turn into a ringtone and click on it to select the song. Play the song and decide which 30-second excerpt of the song you want to form a ringtone. It can be any point in the song. Record start and stop times so you know when you'll put in a few steps. Right-click the song and select Song Info from the drop-down menu. In the Song Information dialog box, click the Options tab. In the start and stop fields, enter the time you want the ringtone to start and stop, and make sure the box box is selected. For example, if you want the first 30 seconds of a song, select 0:00 and 0:30. Click OK when you're done. Your ringtone shouldn't exceed 30 seconds or it won't work, so make sure you do your math correctly. Click the File menu and select Convert, and then Convert to AAC Version. After a while, you'll see a new version of the song appear in the music library, just below the currently selected original version of the track. On older versions of iTunes, you may need to right-click the song and select Create AAC Version from the drop-down menu. Select the new AAC version of the song and copy it to a location on your computer. You just need to drag it to another desktop or folder. Back in iTunes, you won't need a new version of AAC created, so you can delete it by pressing the Delete key. The original track is still set to play only for 30 seconds, so you can fix that too. Right-click the track and select Song Information. On the Options tab, clear the check mark to start and stop. Click OK to save your changes. Now, locate the ringtone files you copied out of iTunes. On your PC, click the View tab at the top of the folder, and then select File name extensions in the ribbon. If you're using a Mac, click the Finder menu, and then select Preferences.In Finder, select Show all file name extensions. Click the song file and then, after a while, click it a second time so you can edit the file name. Click the file name extension and change it from M4A to M4R and press Enter. After you create a new ringtone, you'll need to sync the ringtone to your iPhone so you can start using it. The process of synchronizing is quite simple. Connect iPhone to your computer using a USB Lightning cable, and then click the iPhone icon in the upper-left corner of the iTunes window. Click Tone to the left of the screen, in the On My Device section. Drag the new ringtone file from the folder on your computer to the slide to the right of the window, in the Ringtone folder. The song will sync with your iPhone instantly. Now that you've created the ringtone and copied it to your iPhone, you can specify phone shape to use when a call arrives. Start the Settings app on your iPhone. Tap Tap & Haptics. Tap the ringtone. In the Ringtones section, find and tap the ringtone you just created. You can also set custom ringtones for specific contacts. To do it. Start the Contacts app and tap the contact you want to change. Tap the Edit button at the top of the screen, and then select the ringtone you want to use. Use.
